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Our new Inclusion Hub is now open!

Funded by the NSW State and the Australian Government, the ribbon was officially cut and plaque unveiled by Kristy McBain MP and Ella Mary Dunn on October 4.

The Inclusion Hub has 3 clinic/play rooms, a big room with a kitchen for groups, and a large play gym for supporting gross motor development. We are very proud of this exciting new space and look forward to showing you around.

Supporting children at school and in the community is still our core work for many children. However, there are many benefits to centre based supports. In a room with the child and parent/carer we are able to follow and guide the child's play, without distractions, and work through strategies with the parent/carer present that we may not have been able to otherwise.

Sessions in the gym are a fun way for children to develop their balance and body awareness. Obstacle courses, swings, games and other apparatus build the strength and confidence your child needs to be able to concentrate better and feel more emotionally balanced.

NDIS billing update

As a not for profit organisation it is in our best interests to provide a great service that enables you to get the most from your child's NDIS plan whilst making enough income to keep doing what we do.

At this point in time we are evaluating the services we provide, to ensure we are claiming what we can, reasonably and sustainably, within the NDIS rules.

These are some items you may find appearing in your statements from term 4:

- Preparation and research. Specialists put time into looking up current information and strategies specific to a diagnosis or developmental area and prepare strategies to match your child's preferences and the environment (school, centre or home).
- Making Resources. Prior to sessions we need to photocopy, laminate, collate and generally prepare quality activities before a session.
- Conversations, or capacity support interactions.
 Delivering a personalised service based on a trusting relationship is important to us. Please be aware that our specialists need to claim for their time when the conversation is about supporting you, understanding your challenges and discussing how to best support your child at home or school.



In all cases we will be able to share the resources and/or provide a clear explanation about why we have claimed the time we have taken. This is to ensure transparency and to give you piece of mind that we only claim for the time it takes to improve the quality of our service to you and your child.

Sarah and Fran were successful with the application for the NAIDOC Week literacy grant - the theme for NAIDOC Week in 2023 was 'For our Elders'. As a result, we held three events:

- 1) NAIDOC Community event -7^{th} July 2023—PlayAbility assembled 2 marquees the first marque functioned as a virtual story tent and the second marque functioned as an information/activity tent.
- 2) Eden Elders Family Playgroup 28th August This was a great success with 32 people attending 16 children and 6 grandparents.
- 3) Cobargo Elders Family Playgroup 29th August 2023—This was also a great success with 22 people attending 11 children and 3 grandparents.

At both Elders Family Playgroups, we displayed newly purchased playscapes and read the Sally Morgan books 'Thank you Rain' and 'The River'. Both books are about the importance of connecting to country. All of the families were offered a story book to take home. The books purchased were displayed and many parents were interested in borrowing them from the Toy Truck.


