Play Therapy

Play Therapy is an effective child centred technique used in child counselling or psychotherapy to assist children with their emotional development behavioural challenges and making sense of their lived experiences of trauma. Play Therapy meets the child at their level of communication, instead of asking to use adult communication that is still unfamiliar. Abundant research supports its effectiveness to treat a whole host of child emotional and behavioural issues.

Family Support update

Family support at PlayAbility runs a variety of playgroups in Eden, Bega and Cobargo; and we lend toys to children across the Bega Valley from our busy toy truck. We also offer Individual Family Support for those families who need a little helping hand when things become too much. Parenting can be a difficult and sometimes overwhelmed job for us all. Claire Benjamin and Stephanie Inwood support parents by meeting with them in their homes, in public places like parks, and at our PlayAbility centres. Stephanie and Claire assist parents with making and attending appointments, navigating the NDIS as well as liaising with other agencies such as housing, schools, preschools, medical practices and Centrelink. Aside from this important practical support, Stephanie and Claire also help parents to find ways to care for themselves. Caring for small children can become exhausting if we don't look after ourselves.

One way to do this, is to recognise, learn about and boost our five natural happy chemicals. There is dopamine, which is released as we achieve a goal, and it motivates us to seek new things in life.

Serotonin is released when we feel confident in the world, respected by others and believe in ourselves. Oxytocin is released when our expectations are met. In other words, trust in ourselves and others triggers oxytocin. Endorphins can be released through laughter and stretching our bodies (we don't need to skydive). The last one, cortisol, actually feels bad because it's job is to warn us of threats or just to let us know that the happy chemical time is over. However, if we learn to recognise and accept cortisol as a normal part of life, and not something to get rid of, we make better decisions and therefore

Sometimes, self-care can feel like another job on the never-ending list of things to do. But finding little moments to notice these happy chemicals and finding ways to structure our lives to promote them,

more happy chemicals follow.

is vital for our overall well-being and the ability to care for our children. As Debbie Pincus (a psychotherapist who created the Calm Parent program) says, "the greatest gift you can give your children is to nurture yourself so that you will not need them to do that for you. Give to yourself today and every day. You and your kids will benefit."

Pregnancy, Birth and Beyond is a small and supported playgroup for families with young children that is offered as a collaboration between PlayAbility, Campbell Page and the participants themselves.

Fundamentally, what we do and how we do it is shaped by the ideas and values of the participants.

Over the past month, that has meant that we have been celebrating birthdays! We have had no less than three birthday parties since the start of May. All of them different. And all of them fun.

We celebrated one birthday at the Eden PlayAbility, with pizza-making and a very-chocolate chocolate cake. Another at the Wolumla Kindigym, with somersaults and cupcake decoration. The most recent at Bega PlayAbility, with glow-in-the-dark play and an aeroplane cake. We are becoming better and better at blowing out the candles on cakes!

And then eating them!

Though it may not sound like it, we have also done things that do not involve cake.

Some of us went to Narooma for the Car Restraint Program delivered by NSW Transport and NSW Police, in conjunction with NSW Health, and then headed over to the breakwater to see the seals.

We have since started some first aid training that relates specifically to parenting.

Most of the time, we just gather. In a park. At the beach. Or at one of the PlayAbility centres. Because the most important part of what we do as a group is come together and share a handful of hours.
