The students join us for 8-week blocks, immersing themselves in the PlayAbility community. During their time here, they develop practical skills working with families and also create programs and training materials to share with PlayAbility staff, helping to enhance the skills of everyone involved. Our students are excited to meet and work with all our PlayAbility families during their placements!

As we continue to grow and adapt our services, we want to ensure all our families know about the full range of support available. Your keyworker or therapist is always happy to chat about the different services we offer and how they can support your family. Keyworker Model – A Closer Look

At PlayAbility, we understand that navigating your child's support journey can sometimes feel overwhelming. That's why we've implemented the *Key Worker Model*—a streamlined approach where one dedicated staff member becomes your family's main point of contact.

As your child's Key Worker, we are here to make life easier by working closely with you and coordinating all the different supports your child needs. Think of us as your go-to person for everything! We'll collaborate with other therapists and professionals to ensure all the strategies and supports are tailored to your child's needs, helping them make steady progress across all areas of their care.

One of the best parts? We take on a lot of the coordination work—organising appointments, assessments, and reports, so you don't have to. Whether it's helping you prepare for NDIS plan reviews or guiding you through important meetings, your Key Worker is there every step of the way. Key Workers also provide therapy sessions using a blend of strategies from various allied health professionals and our own expertise, ensuring a holistic approach to your child's development.

Our role goes beyond just providing therapy; we're here to support you emotionally, offer advice, and be there in any setting—whether at home, school, or the community. By building a partnership with your family, we help set goals, link you with other services, and provide consistent support to help your child thrive.

With your Key Worker, you can expect a smoother, more coordinated journey, ensuring your child receives the best care in the most supportive way possible.

Play Therapy

Play therapy is a powerful, evidence-based approach that allows children to express themselves, explore emotions, and build important social and emotional skills in a safe, child-centred space. Through play, children can communicate in ways that feel natural and non-threatening, making it especially effective for those who may find verbal communication difficult. It's a valuable tool in helping children process their feelings and develop coping strategies.

Psychology

Psychology is essential in helping families understand their child's developmental needs, behaviours, and emotional experiences. Our psychologists work collaboratively with parents and caregivers to build their understanding, provide practical strategies, and support the mental wellbeing of both children and their families. They are a great resource for families needing support with emotional challenges or behavioural concerns.

Speech Pathology

Speech pathologists play a vital role in supporting children's ability to communicate effectively. This includes helping with speech sounds, language development, understanding and using words, social communication, and early literacy skills. Supporting a child's communication skills strengthens their ability to engage with others, participate in learning, and express their needs confidently.

Occupational Therapy

Our Occupational Therapy Partners work with children to enhance fine motor skills, sensory processing, coordination, and cognitive function, supporting their overall development.

Therapy Assistants

Therapy assistants are an essential part of our team, helping to maintain consistency and frequency of supports for children and families. Working under the supervision of qualified therapists, they deliver goal-based activities that reinforce learning and skill development in everyday settings. Their involvement ensures children can continue progressing between sessions and allows families to feel supported more regularly.

We also want to acknowledge the incredible dedication and hard work of our entire Early Intervention team. Every day, they go above and beyond to support families and help children We're proud of the work being done and excited for what's ahead as we continue to grow and evolve our services in partnership with families and the community.




